FIGHTING POVERTY THROUGH TRADE

What is Fairtrade?

Fairtrade guarantees farmers and producers in marginalised societies in the developing world a fair and stable price for their produce.

Fairtrade provides an additional premium paid to producer organisations to enable whole community projects such as training, school-building, sanitation and healthcare programmes.

Fairtrade encourages environmental awareness and sustainable methods of production. Fairtrade requires producer organisations to offer safe working conditions and prohibits exploitative child labour.

Fairtrade enables producers in marginalised societies to tackle trade injustice caused by unfair tariffs and subsidies, so that they can reach international markets.

Fairtrade provides disadvantaged producers with a regular income so that they can send their children to school, giving the next generation a chance to avoid poverty.

The FAIRTRADE Mark is a registered certification label for products sourced from producers in developing countries. For a product to display the FAIRTRADE Mark it must meet international Fairtrade standards which are set by the international certification body Fairtrade Labelling Organisations International (FLO).

- **TJ Wines**, Market Hill; sells a selection of Fairtrade South African and South American red and white wines.
- **Waitrose**, Meadow Walk; Fairtrade items include tea, coffee, cocoa, sugar, honey, chocolate, dried fruit, bananas, fruit juice.

- **Bartletts of Buckingham**, Market Square; offers Fairtrade bananas and sugar.
- **Boycott Farm Restaurant**, Stowe; serves Fairtrade coffee.
- **Buckingham Garden Centre Café**; offers Fairtrade tea.
- **Cafédirect coffee shop**, Verney Park, University of Buckingham; serves Fairtrade beverages and a range of other Fairtrade products to eat in or take away.
- **Café Ignite**; at St Peter & St Paul Church every Saturday from 10am- 12 noon. Sells fairly traded tea and coffee, plus a Traidcraft stall.
- **Chantry Chapel** : Book sale and café with Fairtrade beverages Tues—Sat 10am—3pm.
- **Fireside Bistro**, Cornwalls Place; offers Fairtrade hot chocolate, decaff coffee and sugar.
- **Halibut Restaurant**, Cornwalls Place; uses ingredients and offers Fairtrade products including chocolate, cocoa, coffee, sugar and pectin.
- **Hall Farm Bed & Breakfast**, Lillingstone Lovell; offers Fairtrade refreshments and biscuits in all rooms and Fairtrade filter coffee with breakfast.
- **National Trust Tea Rooms**, Stowe Landscape Gardens; serves Fairtrade fruit juice; fairly traded Matthew Algie tea /coffee and Green & Black's chocolate bars.

- **New Inn at Padbury**; offers Fairtrade wine and coffee, as well as using Fairtrade ingredients for menus where possible.

- **The Old Post Cottage Bed & Breakfast**, Lillingstone Lovell; offers Fairtrade coffee and hot chocolate.

- **University refectory** at Tanlaw Mill, Hunter Street; serves freshly ground Fairtrade coffee and other Fairtrade products to eat in or take away.
