247/21 Street Market

Members received a written report from the Town Clerk and recalled that when the Charter Fair visits the Town it uses the space where the markets take place. It is the convention that a small number of stall holders are invited to stand in the area between Waitrose and the Chamber. The Town Clerk explained the area is very small so only 5-6 paired down stalls can fit in. At the moment the Street Market is full so less than half of the regular attendees would be able to stand. This is likely to cause resentment from those who are not asked. The year before last there were a number of issues and a complaint which was debated across social media. The problems are caused by the area being extremely busy with shoppers and Charter Fair attendees and there not being enough space for the stalls and their support vehicles.

Members unanimously **AGREED** that the small street market that takes place outside the Chamber on Charter Fair days is ended.
