The Tourist Information Centre is very proud to continue its tradition of being the first point of call for tourism and promoting the Buckingham economy and attractions in the surrounding areas. It has been open for more than 25 years and since 2018, it has been run by the Town Council, when it became clear that the Town Council could provide it more cheaply and with better local connections than had been possible for Tourism South

East. Since then, the number of visitors, the range of tickets sold and the amount of locally sourced products being supplied have increased.

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY

victims of the Holocaust and the millions of other victims of genocide around the world.

A Holocaust Memorial stone was installed in Bourton Park as a focus for the annual event. The memorial stone is limestone bedrock from Brackley Road cemetery and was transported free of charge by local firm Paragon Tool Hire.

Buckingham Town Council commissioned local Stonemason and a Master Letter Carver Louis Francis to engrave the Holocaust Memorial Day emblem and wording, which is marked using black and gold writing.

A commitment was made by all attendees to remember the Holocaust, and recognising their shared responsibility to fight against discrimination. The Mayor of Buckingham,

Cllr. Margaret Gateley, read 'Belsen Silence' by Lolo Lewis, and later said that: "It was an honour for me to lead Buckingham's first Holocaust Memorial Day commemoration today, 27 January 2022. We remember 6 million Jews, who were murdered in the Holocaust and the millions of people killed under Nazi persecution of other groups, and also in the genocides which followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.

Today was an opportunity for us to reflect on what has happened in history, and also to stand against prejudice and hatred in our world today. We must commit to learning from the Holocaust and from other genocides for a better future."

Plans are being developed to improve on the Holocaust Memorial Event next year, including outreach work with schools. If you are a local school that might like to take part, please do contact the office.

cemetery site at Tingewick Road. The building design is almost complete; while plans for the site layout are still being finalised – including the location of a pond. Draining and

archaeological surveys need to take place before this work is complete and the Council awaits their results.

Meanwhile, at the Brackley Road Cemetery construction of the new garden of rest has been completed and landscaping work is currently taking place. A memorial tree to Geoffrey Suggate was planted on the 18th February. The hornbeam planted, *Carpinus betulus 'Frans Fontaine'*, will be part of a wider design, with a number of shade loving hedges and bushes being planted, including wildlife friendly shrubs.

Longer term, the very end of the cemetery will be converted into a wildflower meadow with a mown path, allowing for walks of reflection in a natural environment.

SPOT THE ROBOT DOG

The University of Buckingham is helping to introduce local schools to areas of expertise such as learning about robotics from their School of Computing's new AI and Innovation Hub which has specialist equipment for academic programs in artificial intelligence, cyber security, games and immersive applications development, and robotics. Our University is the first organisation in the UK to have Birdly, a static flying machine that enables people to fly over landscapes and cities of the world using virtual reality. It also has Spot, a mobile canine robot, by Boston Dynamics, Single-arm Yumi robots and several virtual and augmented reality headsets.

Another way in which our university is interacting with the community is through





residents to participate in a public involvement forum. This is a group of local volunteers who are using their wisdom and skillset to help students studying medicine at the University of Buckingham to become outstanding doctors. The first forum took place last December.

TACKLING LONELINESS

This article is an invitation: what might you do to help make Buckingham an even more connected community, where fewer people feel lonely and more enjoy the delights of being with others?

Nearly half of everyone over 16 experiences some degree of loneliness. More than 1 in 20 say that they always or often feel lonely: in our town, that means nearly a thousand people. These people could be your neighbour, the person who walks their dog at the same time as you or indeed, you. Younger people and those with a disability are more likely to feel lonely much of the time. [*Tackling Loneliness by MacDonald, Kulakiewicz & others, House of Commons Library,* 14/6/21]



Your Town Council and many local organisations are committed to tackling loneliness in a wide variety of ways. For

example, the Town Council are currently helping to reboot the Local Dementia Action Alliance which aims to make Buckingham an even friendlier place for people experiencing dementia. A recent initiative brought a dozen men together to have a stomp across our beautiful countryside. The local churches organise several lunch and coffee clubs throughout the year. Our library opens its doors to all who want to meet others and share in the warmth of a book filled space.



What more can you do?

The Town Council website includes ideas about volunteering (or phone them on 01280 816 426 and they can help direct you). The Buckinghamshire Council website has a list of organisations offering and seeking support. Buckingham library is also a good place to start. But it isn't just about those opportunities. It can also be the random conversations with strangers, shop assistants, internet buddies and so forth. Or chance encounters with neighbours which can be the start of making a connection that could make all the difference to someone experiencing loneliness.

Precept 2022-2023

WHAT IS THE PRECEPT?

The Precept is the Town Council's share of the council tax. This year the precept will rise by 5p per week on a band D property. This is a cost of £175.74 a year and a yearly increase of £2.47 or 1.43%.



THE QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE




Her Majesty The Queen has become the first British Monarch, on Sunday 6th February 2022, to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee after 70 years of
