Summary of responses to date

# Original application (21/8/13)

## NO COMMENT AT THIS TIME

Members declined to make a formal response as insufficient information was available; in particular the absence of the SUDs strategy document, for a site acknowledged to be readily floodable. They have concerns for the effect of the new building and pitch on the brook at the far end of The Buckingham School's field, and the Railway Walk.

Other matters for which documentation was not available, though listed in the D&A Statement, were the Ecological Survey and External Lighting Report, both of which affect the adjacent Railway Walk, in the Town Council's ownership.

The loss of 12 trees and 2 groups of trees was very much regretted and Members would like details of the siting, age and species of the proposed replacements. Though 'Dedicated cycle storage is provided....to encourage the use of alternative transport to cars' and the Travel Plan 'hopes to inspire more students to cycle to school', the provision of parking for 6 cycles, uncovered, is derisory. Well over 100 individuals surveyed for the School Travel Plan indicated cycling as their 'preferred' mode of travel, and the opening of the new cycle route along the A413 to Winslow might well encourage more. However without covered secure storage, this is unlikely to occur, and the School should propose better car parking provision as an alternative.

Details of availability for public use of the sports hall and pitch would be appreciated. Members look forward to the supply of the missing documents so that they can formulate a full response to the application.

## (9/10/17)

The following **Additional Information** had been located on the AVDC website, though not formally advised for consideration, but as it was one of the documents Members requested when refusing to comment on the original application for lack of information it had been included on the agenda:

## NO FURTHER COMMENT

New document: SuDS Strategy.

Members were also advised that Sport England and the BCC SuDS & Highways officers have all requested more information before making comment. It was noted that the surface water was to be drained via the Buckingham School land drains and foul water via Chandos Road sewer, though proof of adequate capacity of either was not submitted, and the map was of Embleton Way, some distance away from the site and at a higher level.

## Additional Plans (30/10/17)

Additional plans: Vehicle Tracking diagrams for lorries entering and leaving (a) by Brookfield Lane and (b) by Chandos Road (the BCC officer had commented that the

previous tracking showed vehicles over-riding the kerbs); electrical services site layout; dimensioned car park layout; all weather pitch plan + two elevation drawings Members agreed to postpone a formal response until the remainder of the missing documents – in particular, the SuDs and drainage details – were available to review.

# Additional Plans (18/12/17)

Additional Plans: Flood Risk Assessment (including the Appendix as a separate document, due to file size) the drainage drawings 25324-600 & 25324-610 and cover letter.

Members left the technical response on the FRA to the County Officers, noting that the field drainage was now proposed to utilise the land drains on the Buckingham School site.

The acoustic barrier would be 4.5m tall, and extend 5m beyond the pitch to the south and overlap the new building to the north, without gaps or holes. Members saw the need for sound shielding if the pitch was to be used out of school hours but felt this was excessively tall, and a barrier to wildlife.

The details of the floodlighting were still awaited, and Members deferred comment until all the additional documents were available.

The new drawings will be displayed, and the file made available, in the Chamber before the meeting, together with assorted other updates as listed.

# PLANNING APP 16/02320/AOP LAND EAST OF BUCKINGHAM BETWEEN MAIDS MORETON AND A422

The Appeal by Catesby Estates against non-determination of 170 dwellings was heard at Aylesbury starting on 23 January 2018 under inspector William Fieldhouse.

Catesby's case was put by its barrister Peter Warren, who said;

\* AVDC's 2004 plan was out of date, and the current plan had yet to be submitted, so there were no relevant policies.

\* That there was a national housing shortage, and whilst ADVC claimed it had a fiveyear housing supply, this had not been tested under examination

\* Catesby was currently working on an s106 agreement which would provide 30% affordable housing

\* That whilst there would be a loss of some agricultural land and loss of views (most of them from Page Hill), the benefits of additional housing would outweigh that degree of adversity, and that while the site was not designated for development, and AVDC claimed it was a site of landscape value, Catesby would argue that it was not a valued landscape, and that there was no heritage objection to the development

AVDC's case was outlined by its barrister Isablla Tafur, who said:

\* It was an unsustainable development, and did not meet any development plan, so whether or not AVDC could provide a five-year housing supply was irrelevant, although she stressed that AVDC did have that supply

\* AVDC's HEDNA has been endorsed by other inspectors after a number of other appeal enquiries (most notably at Tingewick and Waddesdon this January).

\* that there was no need for housing here; it was in the wrong location, when many other more suitable sites were available, and that the proposal went against all relevant government policies

Both myself and County Cllr Warren Whyte were invited to address the Inspector after the opening remarks. I said:

"Buckingham Town Council is opposed to this proposed 170-dwelling development in Maids Moreton, because of the impact it would have on the town's infrastructure. Whilst it is not in the parish of Buckingham, the influx of another 400-plus residents and the traffic they would bring would put even greater strain on Buckingham's roads, schools, NHS facilities and parking. "The proposal is that traffic from this development – which is high above the town and too far from the town centre, schools and the industrial areas for people to walk to – should use a new junction onto the A422, which is already busy throughout the day, and create even more congestion in Buckingham. There is no connectivity with Maids Moreton, so all traffic would be directed towards Buckingham.

"The development would generate increased traffic, as would a further 170-dwelling proposal (16/00151/AOP) pending behind Maids Moreton High Street, which is currently being considered by AVDC, and which BTC opposes for the same reasons. The two applications, if both approved, would create 340 new houses in Maids Moreton, almost doubling the size of the

village. Neither application should be treated in isolation regarding traffic issues, as both would put even more traffic onto the A422, and would need a joint traffic plan.

"BTC is also concerned about the upgrading of the historic bridleway from Maids Moreton to Buckingham, which separates the Page Hill estate from the agricultural fields on which this development is proposed, and much used by riders and dog-walkers. Being on a steep hillside, the development would tower above houses on Hilltop Avenue, impacting upon on residents." "BTC also notes that developer is under the impression that Bourton Meadow Primary School is a secondary school, and all senior schools as well as employment areas are a considerable distance from the proposed development. BTC stands by the comments it made in July 2017. "It should also be noted that a new 400-dwelling development on the west side of Buckingham, which conforms with the Parish's made Neighbourhood Development Plan, has already been approved, and is currently going through the detailed planning stage. Another 170 dwellings – possibly 340 - on the eastern side of the town would put Buckingham's infrastructure under impossible strain."

The Inspector questioned me on the bridleway, asking what objection we had to its being upgraded. I answered that it would be an urbanisation of what was a rural walk forming the eastern boundary of the town. Mr Warren seemed surprised that I had not seen Catesby's latest (January 2018) latest proposals for the bridleway.

(Nothing has been posted on the appeal portal since 22 December. I was later shown a copy, which is only an 'Indicative Bridleway Upgrade' non-specific to this application, showing yellow tarmac paths with concrete edges, lit by columns, bollards or studs – as I said to the Inspector, urbanisation...)

Mr Warren also asked if I had seen the Travel Plan, and I said yes, but my council could not agree with it as it was full of inaccuracies, and that we stood by our comments made both previously on-line and here at the appeal today.

Warren Whyte spoke in similar terms about the impact upon Maids Moreton and upon the A422 and traffic; he too noted the 400-house development on the west side of Buckingham, and said that any further development of Buckingham was zoned for the western side, not the eastern side of the town, following the referendum and adoption of the BNDP in 2015.

The Appeal was scheduled for 3.5 days, followed by a site visit (the Inspector having already made an initial visit to the site, Buckingham and Maids Moreton last week). Having made our representations and listened at length to technical examination of witnesses on HEDNA and FOAN, Warren and I left at the lunch break, there being nothing further for us.

The proximity to St Rumbold's Well suggests that as a potential starting point. Rodney Shirley's excellent pamphlet about St Rumbold gives a number of possibles:

Astrop

- the field near Kings Sutton, where he was allegedly born

Wulfstan

- the Bishop of Worcester, who wrote about him in Vita Sancti Rumwoldi

Alchrid

- Rumbold's father (King of Northumberland)

Ethelwald

- another possible father to Rumbold

Cyneburga

- his mother

Penda Widerin the king his parents were heading to visit when Rumbold was born
a priest in the company of Rumbold's parents during the journey

Eadwald

- another priest in the company of Rumbold's parents during the journey

Natalis

- Rumbold's feast day

High Acre

- the name of the field containing Rumbold's Well

Fowler

- Richard Fowler, Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster, provided money to

refurbish Rumbold's tomb in 1477

Guild

- referring to the many guilds and fraternities that supported the cult of Rumbold in

the 1500s

Conduit

- reflecting the rectangular Conduit House erected over St Rumbold' Well when

water was piped to Castle House

Wellhouse

- as Conduit above, but as referred to in the Royal Commission on Historical

Monuments, 1913

The Dark Ages saw Buckingham as a thriving town for pilgrims, flocking to our child saint's birthplace, so perhaps **Pilgrims Way** may be suitable for the spine road.

Our meeting also suggested connecting this to Roman Britain, in view of the archaeological finds in the vicinity. In my view, Roman names do not fall readily to the modern tongue (I started with Roman Governors in Britain, but gave up after trying to work something around **Aulus Piautius** (AD 43), **Publius Ostorious Scapula** (AD 47) and **Aulus Didius Gallus** (AD 51/2). They actually got worse (eg **Decimus Clodius Septimus Albinus** in AD 192 to 197), although there are over 50 of them between AD 43 and AD 410, when we were eventually left to fend for ourselves. Roman Emperors are a little easier, with a selection that could include **Augustus**, **Tiberius**, **Caligula**, **Claudius**, **Vitellius**, **Domitian** etc, although only a couple of them came to good ol' Blighty.

Roman Coinage may offer opportunities – **denarius** (very common), **aureus** and **solidus** (gold coins) and **sestertius** (the first to represent Brittania) spring to mind (well, sprung out of the pages of Peter Clayton's excellent book *A Companion to Roman Britain*).
