The Planning Clerk reported that the new Town Plan Officer, Sheena McMurtrie would start work on Tuesday 9th April. The consultation period in Buckingham Town Matters and with the University would end on 9th April, after which all feedback would be merged into one document. A letter had also been drafted to AVDC to re-designate the boundary areas, once agreed at the Interim meeting. Appeal Lodged

12/01149/APPLand adj.1 Burleigh Piece Erection of detached two storey dwelling *Members opposed (2nd July 2012) on the grounds of overdevelopment of the plot and an additional access across the footway. AVDC Refused 6th September 2012 for the following reasons:*

The proposal by virtue of its positioning at the eastern end of Burleigh Piece, would introduce a new detached dwelling closer to the A413 than currently exists, and would not relate well to the pattern of the neighbouring development. There would be insufficient space between the proposed and the existing dwelling, giving a cramped and overdeveloped appearance to the site which would be harmful to the visual amenity of the Linden Village Development. The proposal is therefore contrary to policies RA14 and GP35 of the Aylesbury Vale District Local Plan and to the guidance contained within the National Planning Policy Framework.

The Planning Clerk would write to BCC to suggest modification of the signs.
