Cllr. Collins raised ineligible applications and the 'insufficient public benefit'.

The Town Clerk clarified that the applications marked as ineligible applications are not actually ineligible, but rather that the two organisations under this heading had met the funding criteria but the recommendation not to fund is based on a comparison to the other applicants. The Communications Clerk clarified that Buckingham Table have raised sufficient funds to replace the Santa Van at some point and therefore funding for maintenance of the existing van was not recommended.

Cllr. Stuchbury proposed that £1,000 be placed in an ear-marked reserve for future modernisation of the Santa Van. No seconder.

Cllr. O'Donoghue proposed that decision on the Buckingham Table was deferred pending a discussion with the organisation about other options for funding. Cllr. Stutchbury seconded.
