Subject: A413 Buckingham to Winslow Cycle Scheme update

Good afternoon Gentlemen,

I would like to update you all on our progress with the A413 Buckingham to Winslow Cycle Scheme.

<u>Public Consultation:</u> We have received feedback from the questionnaires that were filled in at the consultation events and online. I have also received comments from Sustrans, town councillors and I am due to receive feedback from Adstock Parish Council. So far we have received no objections to the scheme and I will be drafting a report for cabinet member to reflect the feedback received and any changes that have occurred during this stage.

Timescale Change:

A meeting was held between BCC and the Buckingham Thames Valley Local Enterprise Partnership to discuss the SEP projects including the cycle schemes. BTVLEP expressed that some of the schemes are risking underspend in this financial year therefore the money that we do not use could be taken back and used elsewhere. As a result of this it was decided to bring the construction date forward for the A413 to begin in January 2016 under a walk, talk and build approach with an approved contractor. This would enable for any money that is potential underspend to be used on the A413 cycle scheme where there is a risk of overspend. Myself and the team will be meeting with Transport for Buckinghamshire/Ringway Jacobs tomorrow afternoon to discuss the activities that will need to be completed by Christmas and to plan for the construction work.

Dear All

Going off today is a letter from WTC addressed to Andrew Grant and copied to Greg Clark, Brandon Lewis, John Bercow, Neil Blake and Carole Paternoster, which expresses the Town Council's concerns at recent developments. Below is the list of bullet points at the core of the letter.

Sooner rather than later, I intend to circulate 'my flock' of Neighbourhood Plan communities with the suggestion that if we all write such letters, with the same circulation list, it can do nothing but good by showing the strength and depth of feeling in the Vale as to what AVDC Planning are doing and bringing pressure to bear on the Ministers who can and should have resolved the situation by now. My hope is that by providing a set of bullet points that each Council can build its own personalised letter around, will produce a good response. Your suggested improvements/ comments etc on the bullet points would be much appreciated.

- The approval decisions by the Strategic Development Management Committee of applications for housing developments at Buckingham, Great Horwood and Haddenham, which directly conflict with the Housing Policies of made Neighbourhood Plans and are in conflict with the repeated assurances by Ministers that a positively prepared Neighbourhood Plan can determine the quantum of housing for the Plan period, where and were not that housing will be sited and its phasing. This is further supported by NPPF Paras 184 and 185.
- Overview and Case Officers' reports relating to these applications failed to address the clear
 'directive' contained in Para 198 of the NPPF which states Where a planning application conflicts
 with a neighbourhood plan that has been brought into force, planning permission should not
 normally be granted. The significance and importance of assessing the planning weight relating to
 this 'directive' in the planning balance is crucial, yet it has thus far been treated by AVDC Planning
 as being of little consequence.
- Similarly, these reports appear not to consider that positive planning weight should be afforded in relation to the first 'core planning principle' of NPPF Para 17 which states that future development should_be genuinely plan-led, empowering local people to shape their surroundings. This must be an oversight, as Neighbourhood Plans precisely meet these criteria.
- The suggestion for all three applications has been that, in the light of Par 49, AVDC Planning cannot give full weight to the housing supply policies of made Neighbourhood Plans and can therefore only apportion "significant" weight. However, for the recommendations in all three cases to conclude that the planning balance favours approval, indicates a significant dilution of

- planning weight given to the key Housing Policies in the Neighbourhood Plans (the premier planning documents in each case) below the supposed significant weight indicated.
- From Council's research, it appears nationally that AVDC is the only LPA to approve hostile planning applications for housing that directly conflict with the Housing Policies of made Neighbourhood Plans. Council can see no significant justification for AVDC to be so out of line with the many other LPA's in similar situations.
- Winslow Town Council, together with other Councils in the Vale, is very concerned that in spite of
 the significant public interest (over 40% of the Vale's population live in communities with
 Neighbourhood Plans at various stages of development) and are keen to understand why AVDC
 has changed its stance. Sight of counsel's advice to AVDC on the subject should provide the
 required understanding.
- The Cabinet Member for Planning continues to assure Parish and Town Councils that AVDC fully supports Neighbourhood Plans. Neighbourhood Planning is about local (at the community level) democracy and the community support for most made Neighbourhood Plans, in the Vale, has been over 90% voting in favour. The Town Council therefore does not understand how this support converts into recent planning decisions, which are diametrically opposed to those expressed views.

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South West Milton Keynes and Eaton Leys: Planning Applications Update

You will recall that Aylesbury Vale District Council (AVDC) and Milton Keynes Council (MKC) received planning applications earlier this year for two sites:

- a development of up to 1,855 homes, in Aylesbury Vale but adjoining the south-west boundary of Milton Keynes and through which access is taken (known as South West Milton Keynes); and
- a development of 1,800 homes to the east of Water Eaton and Fenny Stratford, around two thirds of which is in Aylesbury Vale and a third in Milton Keynes (known as Eaton Leys).

An update on progress with both applications is set out below:

South West Milton Keynes (SWMK)

Following the initial briefing given to Councillors and parishes in March there has been a period of negotiation and agreement, on a without prejudice basis, between the South West MK Consortium and the three principal authorities with statutory responsibilities in relation to the planning application (AVDC, MKC and Bucks County Council). This has included discussions on a 'Planning Performance Agreement' (PPA), which has now been signed, committing the relevant parties to an agreed timetable for taking the proposals to the respective planning committees for a decision.

Although this part of the process has taken some time technical discussions have also been under way in parallel.

The latest position can be summarised as follows:

- It is proposed that MKC will make a decision on the planning application for the road access proposals and agree its response to the rest of the application, to submit to AVDC. AVDC will then make a decision on the application. To meet the agreed timetable in the PPA it is anticipated that MKC will make their decision in November or December, and AVDC will make its decision in December or January.
- Further work has been commissioned by the applicant following representations from Highways England, West Bletchley Town Council and Bucks CC. This work is in hand and it is anticipated that this will be submitted for consideration by the highway authorities in the early autumn.
- Technical discussions on school place planning, leisure, recreation, community and health facilities, landscape, ecology and sustainable drainage have been undertaken and will feed into a revised scheme on these matters:
- Revisions to the proposals are anticipated to be complete in October.

Eaton Levs

An initial meeting has taken place between the applicant, AVDC and MKC to discuss the mechanism for taking this proposal forward to the respective planning committees for a decision. A PPA between the applicant and each

of the two local authorities will now be drafted so that a timetable can be agreed.

There was also a discussion on the consultation responses that had been received on the applications to identify the key areas that needed further technical consideration and round table discussion. These discussions will include; highways, education, landscape, urban design, and archaeology.

The applicant has also been working with Highways England (HE) to provide additional information, as HE has asked both AVDC and MKC not to make a decision on the application at the current time whilst this is being resolved.
