Dear Ms McElligott (and/or Town Clerk, as requested),

As the officer leading this consultation I wanted to respond to your message. I recognise that the short consultation period won't allow bodies like town or parish councils to make a collective response; however, this stage of our engagement is designed to gain a 'snapshot' of individuals' views. We hope the two week consultation period will be sufficient to allow a good number of people to complete the relatively short online exercise we have developed.

This does not replace the need for a more traditional formal consultation, which will take place towards the end of the year on a draft plan informed by the results of this initial consultation. This consultation is planned to last six weeks and should allow bodies such as town and parish councils to formulate their formal collective responses.

We chose to include parish councils in the promotion of this initial consultation as we felt their members would want to be aware of the consultation and might be able to help us reach people in their areas. I apologise that this purpose wasn't made clearer. I appreciate that some people may not wish to promote the consultation but others have, and have helped us to reach a far wider audience.

We encourage anybody without internet access to use Buckinghamshire's libraries to complete the consultation. Our libraries provide internet access and support using the internet for less experienced users (see <a href="http://www.buckscc.gov.uk/leisure-and-culture/libraries/computer-and-internet-access/">http://www.buckscc.gov.uk/leisure-and-culture/libraries/computer-and-internet-access/</a>).

However, any consultation method will have an impact on the response received. We collect information on the people responding to help us identify any biases in the responses we receive and take account of them in how we use the results. We selected an interactive online tool in order to reach groups which are normally underrepresented in our more traditional consultations, particularly younger people and people from minority ethnic groups. Nevertheless, we will analyse the responses we receive carefully to ensure sectors of the population which are less likely to have internet access are properly represented. Again, as this initial consultation is in addition to a more traditional consultation, we hope it will expand rather than narrow the range of people we are able to reach.
