Dear neighbours,

During these winter months, many things at home and in the wider world can feel difficult. Pressures on the NHS and transport systems, as well as many other public services, have the

potential to disrupt our lives. Armed conflict in many parts of the world causes concerns to many of us. And the effects of climate change are becoming ever more visible, even in our own town.

But even in these uncertain times, there is much that we, the people of Buckingham, can do and are doing to make things better for everyone in our town. I am always deeply touched by the acts of kindness and civic responsibility shown by so many. Our new neighbourhood development plan consultation has raised a lot of interest, showing how much Buckingham residents care about the future of the town. If you haven't had a chance yet to make your views heard, there are further opportunities ahead. There are also so many groups and individuals who give their time, efforts and money to fundraise and donate to local charities. To give just one example among many, Buckingham Rugby Club raised £2,000 for the Mayor's Charities at their annual charity rugby tournament in December 2023, which is both very impressive and very generous.

It is these acts of local kindness and solidarity that make Buckingham a special place to live, and that will stand us in good stead whatever the future may bring.

ANNUAL TOWN MEETING – 18TH APRIL 2024

You are invited

to the Annual Town Meeting at Buckingham Community Centre on Thursday 18th April 2024. This is an informal public meeting that all Buckingham residents can attend, offering an opportunity to ask questions and receive updates on the Town Council and its partner organisations'

activities over the previous year. This year the Meeting will focus on 'the future of Buckingham'. Town and County Councillors will be in attendance to answer your queries on matters relating to Buckingham.

The event will also include information from charities and organisations that have received community grants from the Town Council, giving an insight into how the money has been spent and the benefits this has brought to the town.

There will be several topic-based tables at the meeting; Buckingham residents will have an opportunity to speak to representatives and ask questions, discuss concerns, and put forward ideas:

- Shopping & tourism
- Accessibility & diversity
- Planning & transport
- Buckingham Neighbourhood Development Plan
- Eco matters
- The river and green spaces

This year's Annual Town Meeting is to be held on Thursday, 18th April 2024 at Buckingham Community Centre; the event will open at 6.00pm, with the meeting beginning at 6:30pm. The evening is not structured around a formal agenda; it highlights the issues that residents want to discuss and draws on questions previously discussed through the Town Council's Annual Online Forum. The Online Forum will be hosted via the Town Council's Facebook page and residents will be invited to post questions or comment on a variety of topics. After five in person events, online surveys, two secondary school and sixth form visits and partner consultation the level of response has been excellent.

What were the Future Scenarios for?

The Future Scenarios were not a suggested Neighbourhood Plan or policy, but starting points for discussion about Buckingham's possible future, based on months of research about Buckingham and how it might develop over the next twenty years.

The consultation looked at all of the land that was potentially available for future development (areas of land identified by owners in Buckinghamshire Council's 'Call for Sites') and then asked local people where they thought the development of new housing in Buckingham should take place. Did they think using brownfield sites alone is

sufficient for the town's needs – both residential and delivery of infrastructure?

If not, should new development be to the West, South, or another area of the town? Where large developments will trigger the creation of a new facility, for example, a school or road; where should these be placed?

The Future Scenarios were also presented to local partners, for example, healthcare, transport, and education services, who were asked what impact they thought growth in those areas would have.

Buckingham Developers Roadshow

This time, having established how important infrastructure was to residents, local land owners and developers were invited to talk about their ideas to the public, and how they felt they could deliver sustainable development for the town.

The feedback from the consultations is still being gathered and will be used to influence the next stage of the development of the plan.





NEW SKATE PARK





On 26th January 2024, the final safety tests were completed and barriers around the site of Buckingham's new skatepark

came down. As soon as the park was open, skaters arrived to try out the space – with reviews very positive. This much anticipated new facility stands on the site of the old park (and before that, an open-air swimming pool) and has been built by Buckinghamshire Council using s106 funding collected from developers building new housing in the area.

The new skatepark has been designed with a focus on inclusivity and is designed to accommodate individuals of all ages,

skill levels, and abilities. The park's diverse layout features a range of obstacles suitable for various disciplines, making it equally appealing to skateboarders, BMX riders, Wheelchair Moto Cross (WCMX) enthusiasts, and scooter users.

The skatepark forms just one part of Buckingham's wide outdoor play, sports, and leisure offerings.



MEMORIAL TESTING FOR EXTENSION 1 AT BRACKLEY ROAD CEMETERY

Buckingham Town Council is responsible for maintaining Brackley Road cemetery and as part of its commitment to providing an attractive and safe cemetery for its visitors, the Town Council is required by law to assess the safety of all memorials in the cemetery. From June 2024 the Town Council will begin inspections on all memorials within the new extension of Brackley Road Cemetery.

Memorial safety testing will be undertaken in an appropriate and sensitive manner. The Town Council would like to stress that if any memorial is found to be unsafe, it will be made temporarily safe with wooden stakes and rubber banding, until it can be repaired by the registered deed holder.

We therefore take this opportunity to ask deed holders of burial plots in the cemetery to update the Town Council with their current address if it has changed since the original burial deed was issued.

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE WASTE BUSTERS

Buckinghamshire Waste Busters is an exciting new collaboration between Buckinghamshire Council and Garden Organic to help residents reduce household waste.

The project is recruiting volunteers to spread the message. Mostly they will engage with the public at events across Buckinghamshire - shows, festivals, fairs, fêtes, and markets and support schools and other community groups to compost and recycle, through talks and workshops. We need people with a passion to share their skills and knowledge. Whether you love recycling, are a keen composter, a rampant repairer, or are creative with leftover food, this project is for you!

Volunteers will commit to at least 30 hours a year and can be reimbursed for travel costs. No experience is needed as comprehensive training is provided. This will cover recycling. food waste, re-use, and composting, besides other sustainable waste initiatives such as repair cafés and real nappy schemes. All that we ask is that individuals should live in or near Bucks, be comfortable talking to people, and be keen to support their community to waste less.

Nutritionist and environmentalist Viv Stein is co-ordinating this volunteer programme

across Bucks. Having visited family in Buckingham for over 30 years, she has been a resident of the town for the last few years. "I grew up in a family who always composted, and my mother dug up part of the lawn to grow vegetables,

so it's second nature to me," says Viv, pictured, who previously coordinated volunteers in London to harvest local fruit that would otherwise go to waste. "I also enjoy upcycling textiles and making jams and jellies from my garden



I was keen to get involved in a project that tackles waste and inspires others in the County where I now live."
