


Food Fair – 28th February

The popular **Food Fair** is back on Saturday, 28th February at Buckingham Community Centre, bringing a vibrant mix of food vendors and artisan producers. The event supports our local food businesses and visitors can look forward to sampling and buying delicious treats. Outside the venue will be street food vans to tempt you further.



Where the money came from and how we spent it in 2024/25



Each year, Buckingham Town Council manages a wide range of services and facilities for the community, funded through a combination of local income sources and the Council Tax precept. Here is a summary of how we funded our services and where that money was spent during the financial year 2024/25.

Income: £1,438,766

The majority of our income came from the Precept—the portion of your Council Tax that goes directly to the Town Council—which provided £1,230,480 of our total budget.

We also generated additional income from a variety of local sources:

- Community centres brought in £42,027
- Interest earned on investments totalled £40,707
- Street and Flea Markets contributed £25,902
- Brackley Road Cemetery fees added £24,628
- Events income was £13,003
- Roundabout sponsorship generated £14,913
- Grants received totalled £20,339

Smaller income streams included Lace Hill Community Centre's solar energy (£2,170), Tourism Information services (£7,552), and Shopmobility hire (£311), among others.

Expenditure: £1,346,475.94

Our biggest area of spending was on resources, which includes staff, administration, and day-to-day operations, costing £439,029

Other major expenditures included:

- Green spaces £427,030, maintaining parks and play areas
- Town Centre enhancements (TCE) £183,900
- Cemeteries £160,982
- Lace Hill facilities £35,675
- Public toilets (including Chandos and Shopmobility) £40,085

We also invested in smaller but essential services, including the Greenspaces Depot (£9,856) and grants to local organisations (£31,755). Additionally, £18,163.94 was added to earmarked reserves for future projects.

Thanks to careful financial management, income exceeded expenditure by over £92,000, which helps support reserves and future service improvements.

Christmas Card Competition 2025



Progress at Tingewick Road Cemetery and Allotment Site

Work is progressing well at the new cemetery and allotment site on Tingewick Road. The contractor, Ground Control, has laid the foundations for the entrance road, car parks and the concrete rafters that will support memorials in the cemetery's lawn section. Lawn plots are low-maintenance burial areas where graves are level with the ground and grassed over. Kerb sets are not permitted in the lawn plots, and memorials must be installed within a ground-level concrete rafter.

The site will also offer traditional plots with kerb sets, family burial plots, and a children's burial area. The project management team continue to monitor progress and aim for an approximate completion by the end of 2025.

- **Get vaccinated**: Book your flu jab and winter Covid booster if eligible.
- Seek help early: Contact your pharmacist, GP, or NHS 111 if you feel unwell.
- **Keep warm**: Maintain at least 18°C in rooms you use often, close windows at night, and wear layers.
- Plan ahead: Stock up on food and medication if bad weather is forecast.
- **Register for priority services**: If you are elderly, pregnant, disabled, or need extra support, sign up with your utility providers.

Local Help in Buckingham

- Jedidiah, 13 Castle Street: Free fresh food, Wed–Fri from 4pm, Sat from 9am.
 No referral needed just bring a bag.
- **Buckingham Food Bank**: Non-perishable items available with a referral from Citizens' Advice, GP, Health Visitor, Social Services, or a local church.
- **Repair Café**, The Centre, Verney Close: Open 2nd Saturday of every month, 10am -1pm. Volunteers help to fix clothes, electronics, and more.




I am so pleased to see the Lace Hill Surgery is now in progress and I look forward to better healthcare provision for us all.



HERE'S WHAT WE'VE BEEN UP TO 2024-2025









Environment

This year has seen great progress across projects overseen by the Environment Committee and our excellent Green Spaces Team.

We are pleased to have secured ownership and planning permission for the new Tingewick Road Cemetery and Derek Isham allotments, and we have started planting trees and wildflower meadows.

Brackley Road Cemetery remains well-maintained, and complemented by the popular Commonwealth War Graves tours.

Lace Hill pitches are in regular use, and the Cornwalls Meadow toilets have had a smart refresh.

Work continues in Bourton Park to remove an ageing bridge, and we await updates on the Railway Walk path project.

Planning

Major developments at Osier Way, London Road, and Bourton Farm were considered by Full Council, with two opposed for conflicting with the current Neighbourhood Plan (BNP).

The Committee continues to uphold BNP policies, safeguard the Conservation Area, and raise concerns over houses in multiple occupation, access, and enforcement issues. The updated BNP (2024–2040) was submitted to Buckinghamshire Council in December and is expected to go to public referendum.

Following two years of work with consultants ONH and over 40 meetings, including public consultations, the new BNP reflects community feedback and seeks to secure appropriate infrastructure through developer contributions.

The Committee also engaged in County planning forums and infrastructure discussions along the A421 corridor.

Resources

With many residents still impacted by the cost-of-living crisis, the Resources Committee continues to scrutinise all spending carefully. We prioritise value for money and support local suppliers where possible – for example, sourcing fuel from Buckingham's independent petrol station.

Staffing remains our largest cost, reflecting the town's growth and increasing responsibilities taken on by Officers.

In response to concerns about Management Companies maintaining new developments, we now negotiate with developers early to ensure the Town Council can adopt and care for green spaces and play areas to our high standards.

This year, we reviewed and awarded grants to 16 local organisations supporting the community through activities, events, and essential services.

Town Centre & Events

The Committee, supported by Officers and the Green Spaces Team, delivered a packed calendar of mostly free community events this year. Highlights included Buckingham Live at the Football Club, BandJam in the Market Square, and the popular Celebrate Buckingham Day in Bourton Park.

The Fringe Festival and Food Fair drew strong attendance, while free art activities and events at Lace Hill Centre remained community favourites. The Christmas Lights Switch-On and Christmas Parade were again well received, and the Community Fair helped raise funds for local charities.

We continue to support tourism through the Tourist Information Centre and fund ShopMobility to promote local shopping.

Thanks to careful planning, strong partnerships, and committed staff, our events bring the community together and support the local economy. We look forward to another vibrant year ahead.
