Cllr. Try Proposed that the six external floodlights refused application (25/01975/APP) is added to the action report as it is retrospective. Cllr. Davies Seconded and Members unanimously **AGREED**.

ACTION PLANNING CLERK

Cllr. Draper updated Members on the flooding on the footpath near St. Rumbold's Well: Buckinghamshire Council cleared the lower drain which helped somewhat. The Estates Manager is in communication with the developers to try to resolve the problem.

Cllr. Newall asked if two listed buildings can be added to the action list: 1 West Street and 13 High Street have both been repainted. The Planning Clerk explained that the Russell and Butler building has already been reported to enforcement and 13 High Street will be photographed tomorrow.

ACTION PLANNING CLERK

Cllr. Harvey suggested that a strong letter is sent regarding the s106 invitation, due to the time constraints of s106 monies. The Planning Clerk confirmed that the Town Clerk is pursuing this. Cllr. Stuchbury believes that this action refers to a briefing on s106 and the introduction of CIL; he noted that there is time remaining on the s106 monies. The Deputy Town Clerk confirmed that the minute will be checked.

376/25 Notes from Buckinghamshire Council Committee meetings

Transport, Environment & Climate Change Select Committee (4th November 2025) - Members received a written question submitted to this meeting by Cllr. Stuchbury.

Cllr. Draper commented that the response was respectful but a little vague. She thanked Cllr. Stuchbury for submitting the written question.

Cllr. Haydock informed Members that the name of the Committee has changed to 'Transport, Environment, Communities and Climate Change'.

377/25 Enforcement

377/25.1 Members received for information: An Enforcement Notice has been served on 5 Market Square (JoJo's) for 'without listed building consent, the erection of an advertisement, the construction of a fascia board to accommodate the advertisement, installation of an illuminated window advertisement and application of decal advertisements inside the window to the front elevation of the building' and all the signage must be removed, and the fixing holes in the fabric filled with lime mortar to match the brickwork within two months of 15th October 2025.

Cllr. Davies reported that there are still green lights on the Dipalee. The Planning Clerk explained that they have 6 months to appeal.

Cllr. Try asked why enforcement does not start on day one. Cllr. Newall explained that, due to planning law, action does not have to be taken for 6 months (during the time that an appeal can be made).

Cllr. Harvey asked about the parcel lockers at the University Vinson building. The Planning Clerk said that these were reported and a case file opened.
